“People with disabilities face unemployment at nearly four-times more than the rate of the general population,” said Hernandez. “And it’s not because they are underqualified – it’s because of a prejudice our nonprofit is determined to squash. We are so proud of the people who comprise our community today, which is why they deserve a monetary raise, especially during these trying times.”

Most of the services provided through Mavagi Enterprises have been deemed essential by social distancing mandates.
